S/he will join a collaborative team of experienced, high energy faculty and staff with a record of service to the community. Experienced Applied Behavior Analysts (BCBA-D) (ABA) are encouraged

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to apply.

The successful candidate will be a nationally-known Behavior Analysis faculty member who has the vision to take the program to the next level. The University of Scranton has been recognized by a multi-million dollar grant as the Executive Hub for Autism from the AllOne Foundation serving 13 counties. The successful candidate will be part of this exciting initiative through the AllOne Foundation in addition to teaching in the behavior analysis program.

This is a full time, 9-month position that includes teaching, service, and scholarship responsibilities with primary teaching opportunities available in the graduate program in Advanced Graduate Certification in Applied Behavior Analysis.
