Position Summary

The University at Buffalo, Department of Exercise and Nutrition Sciences is now accepting applications for a full-time position of Clinical Assistant Professor of Nutrition Sciences. We encourage applications from candidates who are historically underrepresented in academia. This is a 10-month, non-tenure track position and will begin in August 2023.

Major responsibilities of this position are

Primarily teach in the undergraduate program in nutrition, but may have opportunities to teach in other programs.

Provide academic and career guidance/mentoring to students and teaching assistants

Curriculum development and systematic program review,

Participate in service activities that contribute to the advancement of the department (e.g., Department,

Demonstrate collegiality in all aspects of faculty engagement.

Be expected to teach up to 12 credit hours per Fall and Spring semesters
