With more than 190 faculty and researchers across six academic departments and numerous collaborative and interdisciplinary centers and institutes, we produce impactful research and impact aimed at creating a healthier, more equitable world. Our interdisciplinary school-wide research priorities include building health equity, creating healthy and equitable cities, preventing firearm injuries, combating infectious diseases, and pursuing environmental and reproductive justice.

Required Qualifications

A terminal degree (Ph.D. or equivalent) in Public Health or related field from an accredited institution is required. Preference will be given to those with expertise in areas that augment and expand current programs and research activities within the School of Public Health. To be considered, this must be the applicant's first tenure-track faculty position. Assistant Professor candidates should demonstrate academic excellence and independence by:

- demonstrating a strong research background in an area of biomedical and health science research within the discipline of Public Health.
- publishing high-quality, peer-reviewed research in a Public Health related area that includes, or ideally focuses on, populations typically underserved in research.
- having independent research funding or outstanding potential for future funding in interdisciplinary work that advances the diversity of thought in Public Health.
- demonstrating a track-record of promoting Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) within their field of study through their research, teaching/mentoring, and/or service activities as well as a commitment to continue to promote DEI in the future through these and/or other activities.
- showing evidence of formal and/or informal teaching and mentoring experience with undergraduate and/or graduate students.
- having proven success with contributing to a positive workplace culture, and ability to consistently demonstrate our school's core values; and
- all applicants are required to have an ORCID iD. If you do not already have an ORCID iD, you
 may register for one on the ORCID website.
