- Qualify for appointment at the Associate Professor or Full Professor rank with tenure at ODU.

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Minimum Qualifications - Education or training

Applicants must have a terminal doctoral degree (Ph.D., Dr.P.H., or Sc.D.) in Health Behavior, Health Promotion, Health Policy, Health Management, or related areas from an accredited program or school. Alternatively, candidates may have earned an M.D. degree from an accredited program and a master's degree from an accredited public health program or school.

Preferred Qualifications

Preference will be given to candidates who have:

- Prior experience as a Department Chair or other significant leadership position in an academic setting.
- Familiarity with CEPH accreditation standards and processes.
- The ability to promote increases in sponsored research activity among faculty.
- A clear forward-thinking vision to advance the reputation and visibility of the Department, School, and University.
- Expertise across interdisciplinary areas of health behavior, health promotion, health policy, health management, or health services research.
- Track record of community engagement activities, service to community/profession, collaboration, and research.
- Experience with program and curriculum development and revision.
- Experience with successful student recruitment and retention.
