This may include addressing modifiable risk behaviors, social determinants of health, strengthening community capacity building, and dissemination and implementation science. The ideal candidate will exhibit a successful history of leading federally funded collaborative research projects. They are also expected to deliver instruction in a university environment and participate in academic and professional service activities, including institutional, professional, and/or community outreach efforts. We seek candidates committed to culturally responsive and inclusive educational practices that advance educational excellence for all our students.
