We are seeking a teaching faculty (non-tenure track) in the Graduate Public Health Program (MPH). With a **primary focus on teaching**, this position will also make contributions to the scholarship and service missions of the school. **This is a non-tenure track, calendar year (12-month) position, fully funded by New York State.**

This faculty will:

- Carry a teaching load up to 12 credit hours per semester (equivalent of three 3-4 credit courses), depending on the amount of scholarship and service. Teaching assignments will include the fall, spring, and summer terms.
- Serve as academic advisor and capstone project mentor to MPH students, primarily in the Health Services Administration concentration.
- Receive renewable, multi-year contracts.
